Dear Constituent,

I hope that you and your family are in good health during this winter. I am sure many of you will be relieved to know that Wiarton Willie predicted an early spring, which we could certainly use given the amount of snow we've been hit with. In Ottawa, Parliament continues to be prorogued as the Liberal party seeks to select the next Leader of their party and Prime Minister of Canada, which unfortunately comes at the same time the US regime continues to threaten us with tariffs on essential goods with constantly moving goal posts.

This past month, my Conservative colleagues have put forward a number of policy proposals that will protect Canadian sovereignty, improve Canada's Artic Defence, secure our border, and knock down trade barriers so we can reduce our reliance on the US. On 01 February, Mr. Poilievre put forward the following to deal with Trump's tariff threat:

1. Retaliate with dollar-for-dollar tariffs carefully aimed at maximizing impact on American companies while minimizing impact on Canadian consumers. That means targeting U.S. products that we can make ourselves, buy elsewhere or do without. For example, we must retaliate against American steel and aluminium, as Canadians can make those vital products at home.

2. Put all the tariff revenues into help for affected workers and businesses; Government should not keep a dime of the new revenue.

3. Pass a massive emergency Bring It Home Tax Cut to bolster the economy, stop inflation and save and create jobs. Canada needs a massive tax cut on work, investment, energy, homebuilding and making stuff at home. The Liberal carbon tax and capital gains tax hikes must be the first on the chopping block.

4. Immediately scrap the Liberal anti-resource law C-69 and greenlight LNG plans, pipelines, mines, factories, and port expansions to overseas markets.

5. Bring in truly free trade within Canada by knocking down interprovincial barriers to help replace lost north-south trade with east-west trade and to make us self-reliant.

6. Rebuild our military and take back control of our borders to regain the confidence of our partners, assert our sovereignty, protect our people, and put Canada First.

For too long, the Canada's Arctic defence has been overlooked. Recently, Mr. Poilievre proposed an Arctic Defence plan which includes doubling the size of the 1st Patrol Group of the Canadian Rangers, acquiring two additional polar icebreakers for the Royal Canadian Navy, and building at least one permanent Arctic military base within two years: CFB Iqaluit, Canada's first permanent Arctic military base since the Cold War.

The border has also been a contentious issue with the Trump administration; however, we should be protecting our border not to appease a foreign leader, but also to keep Canadians safe. This is why my conservative colleagues have put forward the following to secure our border:

- Call upon the Canadian Armed Forces to support border security with military helicopters and surveillance;
- Add at least 2000 border agents;
- Extend CBSA powers along the entire border, not just crossings;
- Install border surveillance towers as well as truck-mounted drone systems to spot border incursions;
- Install high-powered scanners at all major land crossings and shipping ports; and
- Track departures so government officials know which deportees are in Canada illegally.


With recent uncertainty regarding the Canada-US trade relationship, many Canadians are looking inwards at what we can do to make our country more self-reliant. Currently, trade barriers between Canadian provinces are more costly than trade barriers between Canada and other nations as there are over 130 pages of "exceptions" in the 340-page Canada Free Trade Agreement which is supposed to allow commerce between provinces and territories <u>https://www.cfta-alec.ca/canadian-free-trade-agreement</u>.

Canadian Economist, Trevor Tombe, estimated that eliminating all interprovincial trade barriers would boost Canada's economy by as much as 7.9% and generate an economic boost of \$200 billion per year, or \$5,100 per person.

Free trade between Canadian provinces will not be enough to displace the US market; however, it is one option to start bringing home more business and make Canada less dependent on forces and countries outside of our control. Mr. Poilievre has promised that if elected Prime Minister, he would bring together the Premiers within 30 days of forming government to agree on removing as many interprovincial trade barriers as possible. On top of this, Poilievre will prioritize finding an agreement on a standard set of trucking rules to get billions of dollars of goods moving east-west and offer provinces a Free Trade Bonus to get a deal done. 
